WELS NEWS

About 380 pastors, teachers, staff ministers, and lay delegates attended the 53rd biennial Convention of the Southeastern Wisconsin District at Wisconsin Lutheran College June 14-15.

While attending the convention, those delegates heard reports about the kingdom work we do together with all the other congregations of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod. They also elected the following pastors to two-year terms as district officers:

Daniel Leyrer of Bayside, Wisconsin, elected to his first term as district president, after serving one term as first vice-president, replacing Pastor David Kolander of Brookfield, Wisconsin, who asked not to serve again after three terms as president;

Aaron Steinbrenner of Hartford, Wisconsin, elected to his first term as first vice-president, replacing Pastor Daniel Leyrer, who was elected district president.

John Bortulin of Mukwonago, Wisconsin, elected to his first term as second vice-president, replacing Pastor Michael Woldt, who also asked not to serve again after two and a half terms;

William (Billy) Carter of Brownsville, Wisconsin, re-elected to his ninth term as district secretary.

All these officers thanked the delegates for the trust they placed in them by electing them and asked for the Lord's blessing on the work that they do to serve the district and our Savior God.

In separate meetings, all seventeen circuits of the district elected circuit pastors. Our Corridor Circuit re-elected Pastor Steven Bode of Zion, Allenton, to his third term as our circuit pastor.

Over the course of the convention, among many other things, the delegates learned more about: the goal to establish 100 new home missions in the next 10 years; the 44 countries where our missionaries and mission partners are sharing the Gospel, as well as 18 more potential mission fields; the blessings we're seeing at Martin Luther College from the gifts received from gifts to the Encouraging Christian Witnesses campaign; the many resources available from WELS Congregational Services to help our congregations in the areas of worship, evangelism, discipleship, special ministries, and congregational counseling.

The delegates adopted a resolution that expressed support for a plan to ask outgoing President Kolander to serve as an interim assistant to the new district president to help him transition into his new work until the teacher whom the Lord leads to accept the call the district praesidium will continue to extend for a district superintendent of schools is able to begin his work to assist the praesidium with many of the aspects of their work that deal with our schools.
