The Sunday

Last week we saw that there can be a temptation to alter the message we proclaim to avoid apparent failure and rejection. This week we see that there is also a temptation to alter the message we proclaim because of apparent success. If a church makes its central focus things like personal improvement, healing for the sick, or social justice, that church may draw a crowd. It just fails to carry out the agenda Christ has given his Church. The gospel of forgiveness is to be the center of all our preaching and teaching. The agenda for Christ's Church is set. It's the same agenda that was followed by the Church's Christ.

The Service

Today we celebrate the Sacrament of the Altar in which we joyfully receive Christ's body and blood, in, with, and under bread and wine, for the forgiveness of our sins. As we celebrate the sacrament we also give public confession of our complete unity in the Christian faith. We invite communicant members of St. Lucas Lutheran Church, or of another congregation in the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) or of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS) to commune. If you are a guest visiting with us today, please refrain from communing until you have spoken with our pastor.

Preparation for Holy Communion

Do I confess that I have sinned and need the Lord's forgiveness? (Yes, I do so confess).

Do I believe that in Jesus Christ I have full forgiveness for all my sins? (Yes, I do so believe).

Do I understand that in, with, and under the bread and wine Jesus gives me his true body and blood for the forgiveness of my sins? (*Yes, I do so understand*).

Do I intend, with the Lord's help, to change my sinful life, and serve the Lord with thanksgiving in all I do? (Yes, I do so intend with the help of God.)

Heavenly Father, I have come to worship you. Draw near to me in your gracious Word and sacrament, and assure me of your loving kindness. Curb my wandering thoughts, that with undivided attention I may hear your voice and sing your praise. Amen.







2 Timothy 3:14—4:5

¹⁴But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, ¹⁵and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, ¹⁷so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. **Amen.**




